



WHAT IS SACHA?

SACHA grew from a base of volunteers who worked together coordinating the CHF Canada Annual Meeting held in Calgary in 1985. The group decided to incorporate and in the spring of 1989 officially became the Southern Alberta Co-operative Housing Association.

SACHA serves as the regional federation of housing co-operatives and is financed by membership fees and fees for services. Membership is open to housing co-operatives located in Southern Alberta (Red Deer and south), as well as other individuals and organizations, which support SACHA's aims and accept the responsibilities of membership. The Board of Directors is made up of individuals of member organizations. Directors are elected by the members at the Annual General Meeting. The Board with the aid of committees and staff supervises SACHA's activities and reports to the members.

SACHA's staff include the Executive Director, the Member Services Assistant, a team of Property Management Co-ordinators and a team of Consultants.

Consultants and certified CHF Canada instructors provide consulting services and governance and management courses.

SACHA has a sector membership agreement with CHF Canada, which requires membership in both organizations. Members enjoy complementary benefits and services provided by both.

SACHA, together with the members, form a community working toward the same goals and operating by the same principles. This partnership of working together, sharing information and supporting one another, ensures continuing success.

SACHA provides operational and educational services. Many are included with membership at no additional cost and some are offered for a fee that is discounted for members.
